### Help Hoima Update

*Margaret Haynes travelled to Hoima this March ...*

'Visiting the Hoima Hospital I was surprised that there are no wards for specific illnesses, just one for men and one for women. The Maternity Unit had a very large proportion of women needing Caesarian Sections as most babies are born in the outlying villages and those coming in are a result of complications. There is a desperate need for an ultrasound machine. Many patients have malaria or are HIV positive.

'We have now sent over 600 Maternity Packs to Hoima and it was wonderful to witness the distribution to mothers who had no possessions at all.

'We visited the boys' and girls' schools; the Canon Njangali School for Girls has now gained exam status - it is a priority to educate girls so they can become self sufficient; Ugandan girls are expected to rely on a man for support and status. I also visited the Mustard Seed Orphanage, where Evis cares for 45 children and babies. The Hoima Committee has supported Evis' agricultural initiative, the orphanage has cows and chickens and grows crops on a farm just outside the town.

'Pictures and information on Help Hoima will be at the various village fêtes and there will be a presentation at the Family Service at Upton Grey on June 8th. An information evening for all interested in Hoima will be on September 10th; venue to be announced.'

### Annual Parish Meeting

*Held on 21st May, 8pm in the Village Hall*

The new Chairman, Donald Komrower, welcomed everyone to the meeting, including guests: County Cllr Elaine Still, Borough Cllr Onnalee Cubitt, PC Andy Reid, and Di Coate-Bond our newly elected parish councillor.

David Hooper, the retiring Chairman presented his report for 2007. Mr Hooper began by congratulating the Parish Council on their success in the local elections and wished them well. He mentioned the issue of motorway noise and that the council had met with MP Maria Miller. He mentioned other roads in the parish that are in need of maintenance but the Highways Department are proving difficult to contact.

Parishioner's Council Tax has risen by £3.37 per annum for a Band D house, partly due to raising funds for improving the Village Hall. Our lottery bid, along with many others was unsuccessful.

SEERA plans for the local area were discussed, in particular Area C which runs south of the motorway from Polecat Corner

to Dummer. The Conservative Council says they are not planning to build a large number of houses in Basingstoke but the Parish Council will monitor this carefully. Mr Hooper ended his report by stressing the historical importance of our parish and the hope it will not become swamped by new developments in the future. Mr Hooper was thanked by all for his sterling work over the past 20 years and his wife was presented with a bouquet of flowers.

**The Clerk's Report** The current clerk Lorna Cuthill welcomed the new clerk, Sue Lefley, who takes over on 1st June. Copies of the parish council accounts were handed out at the meeting. The clerk commented that the S106 funds for the playground and playing fields represented a large portion of savings. The precept had been raised to contribute towards the hall refurbishments but the precept is still well below the average for Hampshire (£16 per Band D House as opposed to the average of £23). Lorna was also thanked for her hard work and presented with flowers.

**PC Andy Reid** A full report was given; details available from the clerk. Traffic calming was mentioned and also the formation of a Neighbourhood Watch Scheme. If anyone would like to co-ordinate this please contact PC Reid 389 050. The Chairman thanked PC Reid on behalf of the village.

**Village Hall Plans** Sam Preece presented the plans for the village hall. The Parish Council and Village Hall Committee are both working on this revised plan, the previous new build design could not be carried out due to lack of lottery funding. It is hoped that our Borough Councillors will step in to aid the planning process. Outline costs and building quotes to be collated and brought back to the village for comments.

**AOB – Motorway noise** was the main issue. Sam Preece voiced his concerns that the bund committee did not include a resident from Up Nately and the Parish Council was not involved with this committee. He feared that residents of Up Nately might be affected by funnelled noise. He requested that the Parish Council be kept informed and that a representative from Up Nately should be invited to join the group.

Robin Best, bund committee member, assured Mr Preece that the group was informal, formed for research purposes, and welcomed Up Nately to join them. Other members include David Hossack, Alex and Caroline Wiseman and Martin Carfrae. They are also looking for someone with a legal background to join them.

**Councillors** County Councillor Elaine Still has offered to help Sam Preece to apply for a speed limit through the village. She can also help to get us a small grant for our playschool, which will help towards signs '20 is Plenty' and CCTV.

*The Parish Council AGM took place on 12th May attended by County Cllr Elaine Still.*

Parish Council Elections Roger Booth, Nigel Bell, Jeff Ford and Ian Riley remain as councillors. Farewell with thanks for their significant contributions, to retiring councillors, Adam Rendall, Deputy Chairman, who had served on the Parish Council from 1984, and to Jenny Gibbons who had served from 1992. Welcome to new Councillors, Sue Mann and Sheyne Bauermeister. Roger Booth was elected Chairman and Jeff Ford Deputy Chairman. Thanks to Footpaths Officer, Nigel Downes (762 376) who has again offered his time for a further year.

#### Parish Councillors' Responsibilities

Planning, B&D Association of Parish and Town Councils (BDAPTC), Local Strategic Partnership (LSP), the *Villager*, Roger Booth 762456; Country Watch, Nigel Bell 762104 and Sheyne Bauermeister 767 855; Transport and Clubroom, Ian Riley 763 495, Newnham Green Protection Association

(NGPA) Sue Mann 768 560; and Incinerator Liaison, Jeff Ford.

**Countrywatch** Cllr Bell explained that Countrywatch was an association of Parish Councils neighbouring the Lyde/Loddon Valley. It was an effective body which had put up a robust defense of the Valley at the Local Planning Enquiry and would do the same for the Local Development Framework, ensuring that issues such as water over abstraction and pollution of the Lyde/Loddon maintained a high profile.

**Incinerator** It was agreed to maintain a representative on the Incinerator Liaison Committee. County Cllr Elaine Still said that no further action had been taken with regard to excess lighting at night; the Plant maintained this level of lighting was necessary for Health and Safety of employees.

**Highways** Amey has taken over the highways maintenance contract from Balfour Beatty. New orders have been put in to proceed with the overgrowth clearance, ditching and gully clearance promised for Blackstocks Lane, and to complete the work started at Water End. Cllr Elaine Still will assist in monitoring situation and progress. An order has also been requested for road closure and the permanent resurfacing of Crown Lane under the railway bridge; the poor quality surfacing of Heather Row has been reported. Surface dressing is due in Newnham Road. The contractor will sweep the road clear of loose chippings three times over two weeks following dressing; if insufficient, further sweeping can be requested.

**Clubroom** Regarding the proposal for a joint Clubroom rebuild and affordable housing scheme for Newnham, the Parish Council will arrange a meeting with the Clubroom Committee with the Planning Officer, Community Development Manager and Ward Councillors. A flyer will be sent out with the next *Villager* to reiterate the message given at the Parish Assembly; that the Villager Hall facility will be lost unless action is taken and help forthcoming.

**Parish Plans** The Parish Council will liaise with June Balcombe, Borough Council Community Development Manager, to organise a first workshop and devise a questionnaire to identify what is good in the Parish that people wish to keep and what is bad that they wish to change (see next *Villager*). It will then be up to Parishioners whether or not they wish to take this forward.

**Hospice Donation** It was agreed at the Parish Assembly that the Parish Council would make a donation of £450 to St Michael's Hospice in 2009/10. The Parish Council will also consider making a donation of £450 at the end of this financial year if funds remain available.

**Accounts** for 2007/8 were approved.

**Audit** The external audit process for 2007/8 will begin on Monday 28th July. Accounts and supporting documents will be available

for inspection by appointment with the Clerk between 16th June and 11th July. Full details of the Notification of Audit and a Summary of Elector's rights will be displayed on the Council's notice boards from 2nd June and on the website.

Dear Friends

We have now come to that part of the year when the Church's calendar speaks of Sundays after Trinity, Trinity Sunday being held on Sunday 18th May.

We have remembered our Lord's birth, his death and resurrection, his ascension, and the coming of the Holy Spirit to us all at Pentecost (Whit Sunday). We have remembered Jesus' ministry, and all that he did, both to show that he is the Son of God, and how we should live our lives. Now Jesus' ministry is over and its time for the Church to practice what Jesus taught and to be the Church of God.

'Being' is the operative word for us this month, as we start to be The North Hampshire Downs Benefice. This new arrangement came into being on June 1st. We have of course been working together for some years as a Covenant of Parishes, but now we are established as 12 Churches in one Benefice working together as one team on a day-to-day basis. We are still the United Parish, and this is a significant segment of the new benefice, but in future we will benefit from the support of the other seven parishes. We shall also be expected to support them too, when need arises. So exciting, and perhaps exacting times lie ahead, all of which will expand our Christian experience.

Now while the legal formalities may be complete, please continue to pray for all our 12 communities, as we come closer together and share more, remembering that our Benefice will only be what we make it. On the subject of prayer, it was good to learn last Sunday from the Chaplain of Queen's College Oxford, when he and their choir visited Mapledurwell to sing Evensong for us, that they also pray for us regularly. (Queen's is a joint Patron with The Bishop of Winchester for this Church, and appoints your Parish Priests)

We should also remember in our prayers those who have lost loved ones, particularly in Burma and China; hoping too that further help may be allowed into Burma. Please also commit to prayer the work of the various faith leaders who met in Lambeth Palace last month together with the final planning arrangements for the forthcoming Lambeth Conference, when many Anglican Archbishops and Bishops will be attending, meeting together to resolve the various problems that our Church faces.

I hope you all enjoy a 'flaming' June this year, and its many and varied social events. Wishing you the peace of our Lord, and his every blessing,
